**1 David Montgomery** – Marine Painter / Portrait Artist

Montgomery is skilled at capturing a likeness, as well as portraying something of the character and personality of his subject, whether it be a human sitter or a wooden boat that was built at his family's boat yard.

From Sunset Pt. Rd, return to Langsford St, Rt 127, and continue north 0.2m. Turn left onto Ship's Bell Rd.



From Ship's Bell Rd, turn left onto Rt 127, Langsford Street. #63 is the second house on the right after Butman Ave.



Turn right at Mt Pleasant St 0.3m. Turn right at Prospect St 492 ft. Turn into 16a driveway with large brick building or park on the left side of the street.
